The oil industry primarily uses three techniques to maintain oil production in Southern California. Each one holds dangers for nearby residents.



There is almost no fracking in Southern California due to our geology.

The oil industry will frequently open conversations by saying:

"We are not fracking. The work is routine and for maintenance."

"We are not acidizing according to SB4..."

Acidizing for maintenance purposes involves bringing 1,000s of gallons of corrosive acid and toxic chemicals near homes where children and families are not notified in advance.



Stand Together Against Neighborhood Drilling!

Environmental conditions can have long-term consequences on well-being, so addressing these conditions is key to healthy communities.

We have witnessed tanker trucks labeled with toxic and corrosive chemicals in front of homes, smelled the foul stench of fumes, and heard the deafening den of pipes being driven into the ground.

Close proximity to an oil drilling site has been linked to higher risk of cancer and respiratory diseases, odors and noise pollution adversely impact quality of life and increase stress.

We can stand together against neighborhood oil drilling by making our voices heard. Oil drilling sites are fundamentally incompatible with residential neighborhoods. Choose community health over corporate wealth.

History of a Bad Neighbor

- 1995** 10-20 gallons of hydraulic oil spilled
- 1996** Spilled small amount of crude oil
- 1999** Buffer properties north of the site are sold and turned into student housing, bringing residents into closer proximity to the drilling site.
- 2006** Fire on site resulted in new procedures
- 2011** Mixture of oil and water sprayed onto residents' homes, cars, and all over the street
- 2013**
 - Receives AQMD Notice to Comply Citation
 - Conducts gravel packing involving 4,100 lbs of carcinogenic material
 - 2 well rework that involved 6,780 lbs of toxic and corrosive chemicals
 - Acidization job used 2,527 lbs of corrosive acid
 - FMOG workers illegally paint curbs red robbing residents of parking. Some get tickets.
 - Residents attend Public Hearing for Zoning Administration case 17528-PA4 in opposition of the proposed expansion
- 2014**
 - Two Acidization jobs totalling over 5,335 lbs of corrosive acid
 - Two AQMD Notices of Violation Citations
 - Public Hearing for ZA-17528-PA4 where residents again voiced opposition to the proposed expansion
 - After an unreported acidization job, plants on the downwind corner of site simultaneously died
- 2015**
 - FMOG withdrew application for ZA-17528-PA4
 - FMOG cancelled acidization job on morning of community protest

Odor Complaints



In 2014, the Jefferson Drill Site received

29 odor complaints

2 violations for exceeding the legal volatile organic compounds (VOCs) emission limits.

The AQMD will take action steps when:

6 residents from **6** different households call in the odor complaint and are able to meet the inspector

On average, it takes **2.5** hours for an inspector to arrive

Chemicals of Concern Used

- carcinogenic/cancer causing
- air toxins
- corrosive acids
- hormone disrupting chemicals

* operators are not required to report activity on injection wells, but residents witnessed tanker trucks on these dates
 **acidization job was cancelled, no chemical information

Protect Your Family!

1 Find out when well activity will take place so you can close your windows and leave your property. Workers will wear head to toe protective gear and stand behind red DANGER tape, but they will not notify you.
